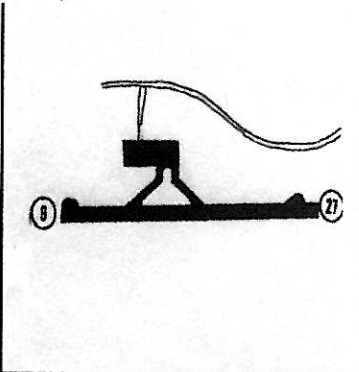
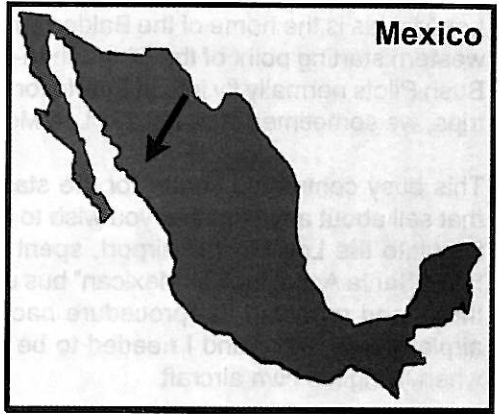

Los Mochis

Los Mochis is the home of the Balderrama chain of hotels as well as the western starting point of the Chihuahua-Pacifico Railway. Although the Bush Pilots normally fly into el Fuerte for the start of the Copper Canyon trips, we sometimes start here in Los Mochis.

This busy commerce center for the state of Sinaloa has many shops that sell about anything that you wish to buy.
